It must not indicate price, costs etc. -2- **POF 1262-A**

Part II "Commercial Offer": It should indicate the commercial terms e.g.price, terms of payment, mode of payment, mode of supply.

- 2.3 The quotation must remain valid for, at least 90 days from the date of opening of commercial tenders, extendable if so desired.
- 2.4 The quotation should hold good for any reduced or enhanced quantities without notice.
- 2.5 In the event of non-acceptance of offer, intimation may be given to the Tenderers on their request.
- 2.6 Conditional offers or alternative offers are likely to be ignored.
- 2.7 Quotations should be based on:-
 - F.O.R. station of dispatch basis, i.e. delivered free on rail, inclusive of packing and forwarding charges. The stores will be booked under Military Credit Note, to be provided by the purchaser.

- 2.8 Taxes and Duties etc. where applicable, must be shown separately, quoting refrences to Registration No. in cases of Sales Tax and relevent authority in the case of others. Offers without these clarifications and inclusive of Taxes and Duties may be ignored.
- 2.9 Taxes and duties levied on or after Tender opening date or on or after the date offer was signed and dispatched will be allowed to include in the offered rates.
- 2.10 "Suppliers will furnish a certificate, issued by Excise & Taxation deptt:, that he has cleared all Proffessional Tax payable by him" offers recieved without this certificate will be rejected.
- 2.11 Suppliers will render necessary information regarding hazardous effects on environment, of the material/products supplied by them, in their quotations and shipping/dispatch documents.
- 2.12 If the requisite information is not furnished on the T.E forms or offer received is not conformity with the requirement of the T.E such offer shall be ignored.

3. INSPECTION

- 3.1 Supplies shall be subject to the inspection and acceptance by the competent inspection authority nominated by the Purchaser, who will arrange it at his own cost. Inspection facilities such as tools, test equipment, instruments etc will, however, be provided by the Suppliers in accordance with the relevant specifications.
- 3.2 Where considered necessary by the Purchaser, stores may be obtained on Warranty/Guarantee subject to inspection on receipt. Rejected stores will be removed and replaced with the acceptable stores by the Supplier at his own expense, within a specified time.

4. TENDER FEE

4.1 TENDER SAMPLE

Where required, offer must accompany tender sample., strictly according to the description and specification given in Tender Enquiry. Offer not accompanied by tender sample will NOT be entertained excepting the established and reputable firms who have either previously satisfactorily supplied the same or similar stores or have submitted an acceptable sample thereof against previous T.E.

5. BID Security

6. ACCEPTANCE OF OFFERS

6.1 POF may reject all bids or proposals at any time prior to the acceptance of bid(s) or proposal, but is not required to justify grounds for its rejection. POF shall incur no liability towards supplier or contractor who have submitted bids or proposals.

6.2 PERFORMANCE BOND

- (a) The successful bidders shall provide performance bond which shall not exceed 10% of contract value, in the form of Deposit At Call Receipt from a scheduled Bank; or, an un-conditional Bank Guarantee on a prescribed format. The performance Bond will be in favour of C.M.A.(POF) Wah Cantt. It will be returned on satisfactory completion of contract.
- (b) If the Supplier fails to furnish the Performance Bond within the specified time, such failure will constitute a breach of the contract and the Purchaser shall be entitled to make other arrangements for purchase of the stores at the risk and expense of the Supplier.

6.3 Performance Bond from State owned organizations may be waived off at the discretion of the Purchaser.

6.4 FAILURE TO SUPPLY THE STORES

All deliveries must be completed by the specified date. In case of failure to deliver the stores within the scheduled time should have arisen from "Force Majeure", which the purchaser may admit as reasonable ground for further time, he will allow such additional time as he may consider to have been required by the circumantances of the case.Otherwise, he will be entitled, at his discretion, to cancel the contract; and/or claim liquidated damages upto 2% but not less than 1% of the contract price of the items and their quantities for each and every month or part of a month, beyond the specified delivery date, during which these may not be delivered, subject to a maximum of 10% of the total contract value of the particular stores which remained unsupplied either in part or in full: or, to purchase from elsewhere, the unsupplied stores at the risk and cost of the supplier.

6.5 PAYMENT

Payment will be made by the CMA(POF) through crossed cheque on receipt/acceptance of stores on our prescribed bill form supported by receipt voucher on part/full supply basis.

(a) Payment of duties/Taxes including professional tax (where applicable) must be supported by proof of having paid these to concerned Govt. Taxation Deptt.

7. SECURITY OF INFORMATION

The tenderer and his employees must not communicate any information relating to the sale/purchase of stores under this enquiry to any person other than the manufacturer or to any press or agent not authorised in writing by POFs to receive it.

The felts in this specification were previously listed in DEF STAN 83-19 (PART 1)/1 which contained both QX and non QX felts. The QX felts have now been separated and are contained in this Standard. Non QX felts are listed in DEF STAN 83-19 (PART 1)/2.

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CLOTHS, COMPRESSED FELTS, WOOL, AND BLENDED WOOL,

PART 4: TYPE OX

This Defence Standard supersedes Tables C and D of Defence Standard 83-19 (PART 1), Issue 1 dated 27 May 1975

- This Defence Standard specifies the materials, method of test, and other requirements for cloths, compressed felts, wool, and blended wool, type QX for Ministry of Defence use for ammunition purposes.
- This Standard is solely concerned with felts for ammunition purposes.
 Felts used for general purposes are specified in 83-19 (PART 1); decorative felts are specified in 83-19 (PART 2); and felts used for aerospace purposes in 83-19 (PART 3).
- 3. Table I lists the standard range from which selection is to be made for all future requirements. There is no Table II as it is not appropriate to this type of store. Table III lists items no longer to be provisioned.
- 4. This Standard has been prepared because there is no suitable national or any other standard acceptable to the Ministry of Defence available.
- This Standard contains all necessary technical information and it is the definitive specification for this material. It must be invoked for all tender and contract purposes.
- 6. This Standard has been agreed by all authorities concerned who are to implement it from its date of issue.
- 7. If this Standard should be found unsuitable for a particular requirement, the Director of Standardization shall be informed of the circumstances. Any enquiries regarding this Standard in relation to an invitation to tender or a contract in which it is invoked should be addressed to the Quality Assurance Authority named in that invitation to tender or contract.

SPECIFICATION FOR

CLOTHS, COMPRESSED FELTS, WOOL, AND BLENDED WOOL,

PART 4: TYPE OX

SCOPE

a. This Standerd relates to compressed felts mainly of wool in a range of thicknesses, fibre compositions, densities, and chemical purity, and of a quality suitable for ammunition purposes.

b. The designation type QX indicates that the material is of a quality suitable for certain applications where a high degree of compatibility with explosives is a requirement. However, its compatibility with all explosives in all environments has not been established, and Design Authorities should therefore seek advice from:

The Director Propellants, Explosives and Rocket Motor Establishment Powdermill Lane Waltham Abbey Essex.

STANDARD PATTERNS

The Standard Patterns referred to in Table I, obtainable from the Authority named in the tender or contract, shall constitute the standard as regards any particulars of properties not defined in this Standard.

4. INFORMATION TO BE SUPPLIED BY THE PURCHASER

Contracts which quote this Standard shall specify:

- s. The NATO stock number.
- b. The item name, description and thickness.
- c. The Pattern Number.
- d. Details of the proofing process, if required. Reference shall normally be made to BS 2087.

5. DEFINITIONS

The cloths in this Standard are defined in BS 4060.

MATERIALS

- The felt shall be manufactured from the materials as defined in Table I.
- b. The felt shall be free from non-fibrous agents, eg stiffening, loading, or reinforcing agents of any kind.

MANUFACTURE

- a. The fibres shall be adequately blended, carded, and felted, to form a uniform product.
- b. Each manufactured piece shall be uniform in thickness and density within the tolerances specified in Table I.
- c. The width of any piece shall be not less than that required by the contract. The variation of width in any one piece shall not exceed 4%.
- d. The felt shall be as free as practicable from ridges and creases, and shall have straight edges.

8. FINISHING

Where rot-proofing is a requirement, it shall be in accordance with Table I.

INSPECTION, SAMPLING AND TESTING

a. Inspection.

Each piece of felt shall be inspected for visible defects. The acceptance standard to be applied shall be at the discretion of the Quality Assurance Authority.

b. Sampling.

- (1) The scale of sampling shall be at the discretion of the Quality Assurance Authority, but unless otherwise specified in the contract or order one sample of the felt shall be selected for tests to the full requirements of the specification, representative of each manufactured lot of 200 square metres or less.
- (2) Each sample for testing shall consist of a strip not less than 150 mm wide across the full width of the piece. For the thin felts a larger sample may be required to provide test pieces of adequate mass.
- (3) In the event of non-compliance with the specified date any re-sampling shall be at the discretion of the Quality Assurance Authority named in the contract or order.

c. Testing.

(1) Conditioning.

(a) Samples shall be conditioned for both physical and chemical testing, as defined in BS 1051. All specimens for physical test shall be cut not less than 100 mm from the lists. 9. c. (# (b) In case of dispute, samples shall be pre-conditioned for 4 hours at a relative humidity not exceeding 10% at a temperature not greater than 50°C and subsequently exposed to the standard temperate atmosphere for testing as defined in BS 1051 for at least 24 hours, and tested without removal from that atmosphere.

(2) Assessment of compliance.

Finished felts shall comply with the requirements specified in Table I, when tested by the methods quoted therein.

(3) Chemical purity.

- (a) In respect of chemical purity the finished felts shall comply with the requirements shown in the Annex. Any modification of these requirements which may be necessary when special finishing processes are applied shall be specified in the contract.
- (b) In the selection and preparation of test specimens a strip or strips of felt shall be cut from the test sample along the dimensions representing the full width of the fabric in sufficient amount to provide more than the total mass required to perform all the different chemical tests. The whole of the strip or strips shall be cut into cubes having sides of not more than 6 mm and all these pieces shall be thoroughly mixed. The specimens for analysis shall be taken from this prepared sample.

Notes:

 With felts, adequate penetration and interchange of extracting liquids may not be obtained if the test samples are not cut into small pieces.

2. Expression of results.

- (a) The pH of the extract shall be expressed in the conventional units.
- (b) All other results shall be expressed as percentages of the mass of the conditioned material.
- (c) Water soluble chlorides shall be expressed as NaCl (BS 3266 clause 7.4.1)
- (d) Water soluble sulphates shall be expressed as Na,SO, (BS 3266 clause 7.5)

9. c. (4) Rot-proofing.

- (a) The content of the rot-proofing agent shall be determined by the method described in BS 2087 (see clause 8 of this Standard).
- (b) When rot-proofing is required, it shall be done by the pentachlorophenyl laurate (PCPL) process. The amount of proofing shall be as required for the normal process described in 3S 2087.

(5) Fibre content.

The wool content of each piece shall be determined by the method described in BS 4407: 'Binary mixtures of certain protein fibres (wool, animal hair, silk, or protein) and certain other fibres (method using alkaline sodium hypochlorite)'. The fibre content is to be based on the clean dry fibre weight.

(6) Lead content.

- (a) Felts are required to be 'lead-free' and shall not contain more than 0.03% of lead or lead compounds calculated as Pb.
- (b) The lead content shall be determined by an approved method. BS 3900 Part B4 has been found to be suitable.

10. MARKING

A drop ticket shall be attached to each piece bearing the following:

Contractor's name, initial or recognised trade mark.
Contract number.
Year of manufacture.
Dimensions of the piece or sheet.
Batch numbers.
NATO Stock Number.
Pattern number and thickness.
Item name and description.

and in addition such other markings as the contract or order may direct.

11. DELIVERY

The felt shall be delivered rolled, or in flat sheets, as required by the contract, and in a clean and air dry condition.

12. PACKAGING

Packaging shall be in accordance with the terms of the contract.

NOTES APPLICABLE TO THE TABLES

- For the purpose of recording Service management interest the Table I and Table III items should be treated as being applicable to all three Services.
- The Navy management code for felt is 0462, therefore the full Navy number is the last seven digits of the NATO Stock Number prefixed by that code, eg 0462/942-2009.
- The Army management code for felt is H4, therefore the full Army number is the NATO Stock Number prefixed by that code, eg H4/8305-99-942-2009.
- 4. The Air Force management code for felt is 32B, therefore the full Air Force number is the last seven digits of the NATO Stock Number prefixed by that code, eg 32B/9422009 (the number is not hyphened).
- 5. indicates that the column heading does not apply.
- 6. RR indicates rotproof.
- 7. LF indicates 'lead-free' within the limits defined in sub-clause 9c(6).
